Scoutmaster's Report

- National Meeting in Dallas
 - Pressure to remove duty to God (never happening). Guidelines will be given out for the new policy taking effect in January 2014. More conflicted/confused kids at scout age than people think. They thought there'd be more backlash from certain groups than there was. Mark offered to take questions. There were none.
 - New merit badges Sustainability will run either/or with Environmental Science;
 Cooking will be required for Eagle; CAD replacing Drafting; Digital Technology replacing
 Computer

 - o 2014 Paperless rechartering
 - o 2015 One oath and law for all scouting groups (Boy Scout version)
 - o 2015 online paperless advancement

 - Handbook organization by rank or by topic? Split vote, decision was made to do by topic with rank indicator – how it is now.
 - My Scouting Tools will be the basis for things to be available online. Their IT
 department is being challenged to make it more robust. Key 3 access to troop info
 (Mark, Jason & commissioner) with allowable access for others. 24% of scouts don't
 have internet access, 36% don't have high-speed.
 - Youth Protection Policy should be on the troop website (link to national); some require youth protection for adults to attend meetings. Cyber-chip (online safety like toten chip)?
 - o 80% of units are sponsored by churches.
 - Scouting.org scoutcast last Friday of every month on a different topic. Link to video in emails or on Facebook?
 - 411 strategic plan is changing lots of programs (especially cubs), training changing to more online, commissioners to act as mentors.
